


NOTICE OF PROPOSED PLACEMENT OF PUBLIC ART

The City of Vista's Public Art Commission is seeking public input on wall one of the three walls in the Paseo Santa Fe downtown district. The art walls are located in the linear park adjacent to 325 S. Santa Fe Avenue, and are constructed of split face concrete block, and measure 30' by 8'.

Name of Artist: Buddy Smith - Through my research for this project, I found poppies to be a symbol for the fallen soldiers. It seems fitting to have the poppy flower as the focus of my Veteran Memorial Wall design.

The poppies will be cut from concrete panels most known as Hardibacker board. Each petal of the flowers will be cut out separate and coated with a thin layer of concrete for texture. The flowers will then be painted with a durable long-lasting exterior paint, Behr Marquee. The center of the flowers will be covered with fused glass droplets for a nice texture and dimensional feel. The flowers will be attached using an adhesive on the backside along with screws drilled into the concrete.



Individuals are encouraged to view and comment on the proposed project, during the public viewing period which will occur from August 11, 2016 to September 12, 2016.
