## Entryway Beautification Project Underway

The City of Vista recently purchased property on Civic Center Drive near the corner of Pala Vista Drive. This location is along one of the main routes to the Vista Civic Center, which serves as a key entrance way into the city. Enhancing this corner is part of the citywide effort to revitalize the main entry ways into the city. The character and beauty of entryways into a city can have a great impact on economic development and leave a lasting impression on visitors and residents.

The existing old, deteriorated buildings on the property will be demolished and the space will be developed into a park. This undertaking meets two of the City Council's top priority 2016-18 goals: Continue to decrease blight and improve the image of the city; and add additional park space. The timeline for the design and construction of the park will be determined in early 2017. Park development fees and other funding sources will be identified and allocated to finance the project.

## Red Light Enforcement Cameras Discontinued

The Vista City Council voted (3-0 with 2 abstentions) during its October 11 meeting to discontinue the Red Light Photo Enforcement program. The photo enforcement cameras snap images of drivers who run red lights and the drivers are then issued a citation. The red light cameras will be discontinued on November 30, 2016. Citations will still be issued through November 30. The City Council also discussed the continued success and future plans for creating a traffic management plan to make the City's intersections and roads safer (see page 7).

Download the City of Vista's new mobile app for quick access to city information and services. ## Downtown Gets New Directional Signs



Look for new directional "wayfinding" signs popping up around downtown in 2017. The updated signs will make the city more accessible and inviting to all, directing the public, especially visitors from HWY 78, to the community's many downtown amenities and public parking areas. This will reduce congestion and confusion - so the public has more time to enjoy what downtown has to offer. A committee comprised of the Mayor, Deputy Mayor, city staff, the Vista Chamber, the Vista Village Business Association, and a local sign company worked with a wayfinding professional to create the designs.

To enhance the downtown experience for residents, workers and visitors, the City will also be installing new energy efficient light fixtures downtown. The new, higher illumination is expected to improve the light output along the sidewalks and streets.




## Mobile Vet Clinic Offers Affordable Vaccinations

## Managing Vista's Traffic

The City of Vista's major road network, combined with many collector streets, provides a good connection for local residents to access destinations within the city. However, at the regional level, the road

network picture is different. Freeway connections are lacking in North County, making local roads an attractive option for pass-through motorists, which adds to the traffic volumes, especially during the afternoon rush hour. Over the past year, traffic congestion management projects were either constructed or installed to mitigate some of the traffic congestion, including, adding a third left turn lane on Sycamore Drive at S. Melrose Drive; restriping Civic Center to add a second left turn lane onto E. Vista Way; installing traffic signal modifications; synchronizing signal timing on the various corridors; and restriping street surface pavement to accommodate additional turn lanes.

### New Traffic Management Control Plan

In September, the City Council approved a Traffic Congestion Management plan outlining projects designed to provide further traffic congestion relief. This plan categorizes and prioritizes the projects as either short term or long term/large scale undertakings. Simple, relatively inexpensive improvements, such as striping and signal modifications or minor road widening to fit within the existing right-of-way are categorized as short term projects. However, in some cases, long term, large scale projects have been planned because simple, inexpensive solutions are not feasible.

To begin executing the proposed traffic congestion projects in the near term and to continue managing traffic congestion in the long term, \$485,000 has been set aside for five traffic management projects. Another \$150,000 a year will be set aside on an annual basis beginning July 1, 2017.

The project financing draws from a mixture of Transnet (voter approved half-cent sales tax funding transportation projects throughout San Diego County) funds and from residential and commercial developer fees collected by the City to cover the traffic impacts brought about by private development projects.

### Short Term Projects

1. N. Melrose Drive between W. Vista Way & Bobier Drive: Restripe to add a third lane.
2. Vista Village at N. Santa Fe Ave; Vista Village at Olive; N. Santa Fe Ave at Main Street: Traffic control system upgrade to manage the three intersections.
3. Traffic Signal Interconnect Upgrade in northern Vista to existing traffic signals for optimized traffic signal timing and coordination.
4. E. Vista Way at Bobier/Foothill Drive: Widen, add second WB left turn lane. (Developer project). City will restripe to add a second EB left turn lane.
5. Traffic Measurement System to monitor congestion, quantify performance measures and conduct origin destination studies on vehicle trips.

### Long Term Projects

1. Civic Center Drive at S. Santa Fe Ave: Install a NB right turn lane.
2. Civic Center Drive at Postal Way: Install a NB right turn lane.
3. E. Vista Way between Taylor Street and northern city boundary: Widen E. Vista Way to accommodate four lanes.
4. Civic Center Drive between S. Santa Fe Avenue and R/R tracks: Widen Civic Center Drive to add a third through lane – each direction.






